<b>Prevenar 13</b>			PCV13 – 2 months (from 6 weeks), 4 & 12 months; catch-up to age <5 years; 6 months of age for a medical risk factor or born prematurely <28 weeks gestation
<b>Rotarix</b>			RV – 2 months (from 6 weeks) & 4 months of age
<b>M-M-R II / Priorix</b>			MMR – 12 months; catch-up to age <20 years; refugees & all humanitarian entrants
<b>Nimenrix</b>			Meningococcal ACWY – 12 months; catch-up to age <20 years if meningococcal C vaccine missed; Year 10 secondary school and all adolescents 15 - 19 years of age.
<b>ActHIB</b>			Hib -18 months; catch-up <5 years
<b>Priorix-Tetra / ProQuad</b>			MMRV – 18 months; catch-up to age <14 years
<b>Infanrix / Tripacel</b>			DTP – 18 months; catch-up to age <10 years
<b>Infanrix IPV / Quadracel</b>			DTP-IPV – 4 years; catch-up to age <10 years
<b>Varivax</b>			VV – Catch-up to age <20 years; refugees & all humanitarian entrants; vulnerable people if age appropriate
<b>Gardasil 9</b>			HPV – Year 7 secondary school or aged 12 - 13 years; catch-up to age <20 years; vulnerable people if age appropriate
<b>Boostrix</b>			dTp – Year 7 secondary school or aged 12 - 13 years
<b>H-B-Vax II adult</b>			Hep B – Catch-up aged 11 - 15 years; refugees & all humanitarian entrants ≥ 20 years; vulnerable people ≥ 20 years if age appropriate

<b>Influenza (Fluad, higher-immunogenicity)</b>			TIV — 65 years of age & over
<b>Influenza as supplied</b>			QIV — <65 years of age for all Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people; <65 years of age with medical risk factors; Pregnant women
<b>Influenza (FluQuadri)</b>			QIV — 3 years to <5 years of age
<b>Influenza paediatric (FluQuadri Jnr)</b>			QIV — 6 months to <3 years of age
<b>Pneumovax 23</b>			PPV23 – 65 years of age; Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people aged 50 years; 4-5 years of age with a medical risk factor or born prematurely <28 weeks gestation
<b>Zostavax</b>			VZV – 70 years of age; catch-up for 71 - 79 years of age
<b>Tubersol</b> 1ml vial = about 10 tests			Human Tuberculin skin test – aged >6 months

<b>Engerix-B®</b> Hepatitis B vaccine		
Adult (ENGBI)		Hep B — All Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander people – hepatitis B non-immune
Adult (ENGEC)		Hep B — People born in priority hepatitis B endemic countries & arrived in Australia in the last 10 years. (Priority countries include China, Philippines, Malaysia, Vietnam, Afghanistan, Thailand, South Korea, Myanmar (Burma) Indonesia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Taiwan & Cambodia)
Adult (ENGSC)		Hep B — Household contacts & sexual partners of people living with hepatitis B
Adult (ENGIDU/ENGEC)		Hep B — People who inject drugs or are on opioid substitution therapy; people living with Hepatitis C
Adult (ENGMSP/ENGB)		Hep B — Men who have sex with men; People living with HIV
Adult (ENGP)		Hep B — Prisoners and Remandees; people no longer in a custodial setting who commenced but did not complete a vaccine course while in custody.
<b>M-M-R-II®</b> (MMRA)		MMR — Infants aged from 6 months to <11 months prior to overseas travel; Women planning pregnancy or post-partum with low or negative rubella antibody levels; People born during or since 1966 and aged 20 years & over requiring 1 or 2 doses (without evidence of receiving 2 documented doses of valid MMR vaccine or without serological evidence of immunity)
<b>Gardasil®</b> (GARDMSM)		HPV 4 valent – Men who have sex with men - no age limit Time-limited vaccine program ending 31 October 2019
<b>Boostrix (BOO)</b>		dTp – Partner's whooping cough vaccine program
