## Eligibility & age recommendations for the free influenza vaccine brands

### Who is eligible?

- All children aged 6 months to <5 years (Victorian government funded program)
- People aged 5 years and over who have a medical risk factor that increases their risk of complications from influenza
- All Aboriginal people aged 15 years and over
- All pregnant women anytime during pregnancy
- All adults aged 65 years and older

### 65 years of age and over

#### Trivalent — Flud® or Fluzone® High-Dose



- All people aged 65 years and over
- Higher-immunogenicity influenza vaccine

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*Eligibility & age recommendations for using the free influenza vaccine brands continued*

**6 months to less than 3 years of age**

**Quadrivalent — FluQuadri™ Junior**



- All children\* aged 6 months to less than 3 years
- \*2 doses spaced by a minimum of 1 month in the first year of flu vaccination

**3 years to less than 65 years**

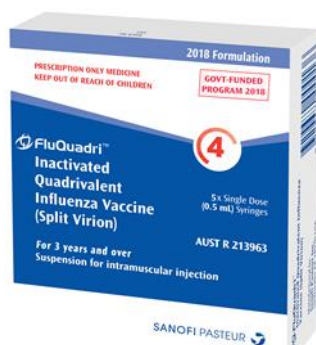
**Quadrivalent — FluQuadri™ or FluarixTetra®**



- All people\* aged 3 years to less than 65 years
- \*Eligible children aged less than 9 years, 2 doses spaced by a minimum of 1 month in the first year of flu vaccination

**18 years to less than 65 years**

**Quadrivalent — Afluria Quad®, or FluQuadri™ or FluarixTetra®**



- Afluria Quad® - only use from 18 years of age (not registered for use less than 18 years of age)
