 Overall measure of Good to Go is to reduce length of stay by 10%.












Patients waiting for discharge

Pts not ready for discharge

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






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Delays to discharge

Communicate what needs to be achieved before discharge

Discharge when the patient is clinically ready

Nurses must complete the CLD competency and have adequate specialist clinical knowledge to be deemed competent to discharge.

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
